# **EPISODE 11: RECOUNTING THE PAST**

#### RECOUNTING THE PAST

Recounting a story, incident or event is to write or talk about something, which has happened in the past.

It may be an event from your life (personal recount), a narrative, biography, diary entry or another form of description.

When describing events which have already occurred in the past, it is necessary to use past tense verbs and time expressions/words which order past events or refer to points of time in the past.

# **STUDY TIPS**

When recounting in the past whether it writing a biography or describing a sequence of events for example, it is important to establish clearly the relationship between different past actions.

The past perfect focuses on a specific past time first and then refers back to an action, event or situation that occurred before that time.

## **Simple Past and Past Perfect Tenses**

These notes compare simple past and past perfect use, and focus on time expressions in relation to the order or sequence of past actions, events, or situations.

Expressions	Examples	
<ul> <li>Referring to points of time in the past</li> <li>prepositions: at, in, on</li> </ul>	Profits decreased in the first quarter.	
<ul> <li>yesterday, yesterday morning, yesterday evening, last month, before last, ago, earlier, in the past</li> </ul>	They cancelled classes yesterday morning. Interest rates rose last week. I saw him in class the day before last. John completed his studies two years ago. In the past, life was much simpler.	
Time Clauses Order or Sequence of Past Events	Pattern  time clause can occur before or after the main clause  or  time clause [past tense], + main clause (if the clause contains new information) [past tense]  main clause [past tense] + time clause [past tense]	
<ul><li>as soon as</li></ul>	It <b>started</b> to rain <b>as soon as</b> he <b>arrived</b> at his destination.	
<ul><li>before</li></ul>	<b>Before</b> he <b>arrived</b> at the school, John <b>rang</b> his colleagues.	
<ul><li>after</li></ul>	After he got his results, he enrolled on the course.	
■ when	When John got to his seat, the film began.	
■ until	John waited until everyone left the cinema.	
■ once	Once John finished his exam, he relaxed for the rest of the day.

Time expressions	Examples
<ul><li>when</li></ul>	When I arrived for class, the lesson had started.
<ul><li>by + a specific time</li></ul>	By two o'clock, the candidates had completed the IELTS test.
<ul><li>by then</li><li>by the time + simple past</li></ul>	I got to the station at two o'clock, but everyone had left by then.  By the time I got to the station, everyone had left.
