If you look up there on the right, you can see the temple.

If you look over there behind the bridge, you can see the market.

Over there, on the left, you can see the gardens. That's where they have the annual festival.

Over there, on the right, that's the art gallery. That's where we'll go tomorrow morning.

You can see the lake **over there**, **in front of the** hotel. That's where they have the boat races.

Over there, behind the sports arena, that's the concert hall. That's where we'll go tonight.
